Covid Situation Prompts Innovative Solutions

COMMUNITY-LED TECH DRIVE ENABLES E-LEARNING

As the entire world has been coping with the COVID-19 pandemic, these past months our partner schools have been dealing with the situation keeping the foremost in mind—the safety of the children and minimal disruption to their classes and learning.

A key initiative in this direction has been the innovative 'Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Gurukulam' initiative that was launched on the 16th of May, 2020. The program endeavours to take the classroom into the homes of the students as, this year, the chances of having children attending school look increasingly challenging.

The online classroom program has been taken up on a war footing to translate the curriculum into online content that can be accessed by the students, from the safety and comfort of their homes, anytime. The program is available on multiple channels, including a free mobile app and YouTube. Further, students who do not have a device to access the content and lectures, have been provisioned with one by the schools through a volunteering program. The community has come together to help the initiative by donating old phones to students who need them, while some have gone the extra mile and sponsored new devices.

An interesting aspect of the 'Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Gurukulam' initiative is that the content is open for anyone to access and benefit from. Over the past three months, the lecture videos and content has been a source of education and motivation for not only students from our partner schools, but many more children from outside of our schooling program. Further, the content is not limited to only academic topics but also covers life skills and spiritual education.

elel Foundation Launches 'Each One Embrace One'

A FULL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Each One Educate One program started in 2014 as an informal coming together of a few like-minded individuals with a shared vision of rural empowerment through education. Today, the initiative has slowly grown into a global people's movement, which serves as a platform for many around the world to contribute to the field of education.

Along the way, many wonderful people, ideas and best practices have become a part of the program and a part of its growth. At the centre of elel, however, has always been the boy or girl who is currently studying in one of our many schools. These children are a part of our family and the endeavour has consistently been to keep ourselves tuned to the students' needs and ensure that students complete their education without any disruptions. During one such ear-to-the-ground conversations, we learnt that a few students were unable to afford the hostel fees (the elel program was, at the time, only sponsoring the school fees).

This need birthed a new, all-encompassing scholarship programme called the Each One Embrace One, a full sponsorship program for students who hail from some of the most disadvantaged communities. The program will cover the student's costs, end-to-end, during his/her time as a part of our schooling system. This includes both the school/tuition fees and hostel expenses. The cost of sponsoring a student through this full sponsorship program has been pegged at INR 70,000 or USD 1000 per year in consultation with our partner schools.

COVID-19 and its disruptive impact on the communities that our students come from puts them at risk of being excluded from continuing their education in the absence of such an intervention. The Each One Embrace One program has come at the right time to specifically address the risks that these communities face.

Re-emphasizing our commitment to holistic education

A PEDAGOGY IN HOLISTIC EDUCATION

It has been over 50 years since the inception of the first of our partner schools. Since then, the start of each new school has helped promote our unique approach to holistic education. Today, while our schools cater to the underserved sections in rural communities through free education, at the core of its pedagogy is the holistic education it offers— giving equal emphasis to the physical, intellectual, emotional and spiritual aspects of a child's personality and growth.

CHANGING TIMES

One of the most important changes that human society has witnessed in the past 50 years is the way we access and process information. While on one side, the need to upgrade the curriculum to match global scenarios has opened us up to new technologies, the obsoleteness of the old ways of learning, such as long lesson plans, frequent exams, and severe competition has led to increased dissatisfaction.

This leaves very little scope for the development of other aspects of their personality including pursuing their passions, choosing subjects of their liking, and alternate professions rather than simply following the herd. The emotional, mental and spiritual aspects of a child's personality have been compromised in the name of intellectual brilliance. This has led to a lopsided approach to education and has proven disastrous for the happiness quotient of the youth.

ADAPTING TO CHANGE

The last three months have given the administrations of these schools the much needed time to introspect and recalibrate. In order to give greater emphasis to the JOY OF LEARNING, certain best practices have been given due consideration.

The current review and change process endeavours to emphasise the values that define the holistic approach to our education in terms of imparting high-quality academic education, balanced with cultural and spiritual values like service to mankind, compassion for fellow beings, understanding of the spiritual culture of India and its practice in daily life. For the child to have a well-rounded personality and to be able to withstand the pressures of life, in any progressive education system, there needs to be equal emphasis on the Physical, Intellectual, Emotional and Spiritual aspects.

After much deliberation, the three trusts that govern the 24 Each One Educate One partner schools, have decided to transition from the traditional system of education under the Karnataka/ Central Board of Secondary Education curriculum to the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) system and curriculum, which augurs well for our vision of balanced and holistic education, by helping reduce the stress of frequent testing and examinations on our students, and allowing more flexibility in choosing subjects according to one's interest and inclination, leading to a better performance. This has been done after several discussions with educational authorities and other stakeholders. Furthermore, in keeping with the true nature of our fully residential schools, these schools will henceforth be referred to as 'Gurukuls'.

These changes will come into effect, as our partner schools open for the current academic year (2020-21).

About National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS):

- Largest open schooling system in the world.
- Recognition is equivalent to all other education boards of India.
- Flexibility and range of subjects for study.
- Options to choose subjects that are of interest and relevance for the student.
- More emphasis on English-speaking skills, soft skills and computer literacy.


